
The Shape of the Book of Psalms†



First Editorial Stage (Pss 2-89)

- Made up of primarily titled psalms
- Organized primarily by authorship & genre designations
- Royal psalms placed at the seams of the collections
- Qumran evidence: relatively stable before 1st century BCE

Second Editorial Stage (Pss 1, 90-150)

- Made up of primarily untitled psalms
- Organized by sequences of hllwhy conclusions and hwdw introductions
- Qumran evidence: fluid until the 1st century CE
- Editing precipitated by the first Jewish war (66-70) and Yavneh
